Driving Directions:

- Take a left from the NAS 1 gate. After about 3km, turn right and take the A19 towards Catania.
- After about 4km, take the exit for Messina and the A18.
- Just past Catania, you'll go through a toll booth where you'll need to get a ticket.
- Follow the A18 north to Messina, about 1 hour 15 minutes. Pay the toll at Messina.
- Past Messina, keep straight, take the A20 towards Palermo. Take a ticket at the toll booth and follow the A20.
- Exit at Patti after another 45 minutes. Pay the toll.
- Take the first left after toll. After about 1km, you'll reach a large intersection where you'll want to turn right.
- Follow this road for about 1km. The Caleca Factory is the large white building on your left.
- The second entrance is the outlet store. **Estimated driving time:** 2 hours
